Current Projects and Accomplishments

- Organized "Oakton Day at the Park" for three consecutive years; the first community-building event of its kind in the Oakton area
- Published the first-ever Oakton Community Directory, providing a handy consolidated listing of local businesses, schools, nonprofits, government officials, parks, and services
- Working to make the historic Oakton Schoolhouse a real community resource again
- Making improvements to Oakton Community Park:
 - Arranged with park officials to add picnic tables, a new bench, a bicycle rack, and plantings and to have the grass mowed more regularly
 - Helped propagate a natural meadow; arranged with Scouts to repair woodland benches and install a butterfly garden; worked with Virginia Bluebird Society to install bluebird houses.
 - Instituted a program of monthly sessions to remove invasive plants from the park
- Helping to preserve the "Witness Tree," the 250-year-old white oak tree on Hunter Mill Road
- Working with community to make new developments such as the proposed projects at the AT&T site more responsive to Community interests
- Supporting calls for greater attention to pedestrian safety along busy roadways such as Blake Lane and advocating for extending sidewalks along Hunter Mill to serve the park, library, and retail areas
